



I recently had the great pleasure of hosting our 2022 State of the City event at the beautiful Ocean Institute. This annual event is an opportunity to share what makes Dana Point such a special place to live and do business. This year, we celebrated local entrepreneurs who are the heart and soul of our city. Their success is a testament to how valued the support of our local community is to their livelihood and ability to thrive and grow.

This is important when you consider that we have 77,557 square feet of new commercial and retail space being developed in the city right now to attract new businesses and restaurants as well as help existing businesses expand.

I encourage you to watch the video (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=H2FZsTQ5E7Y) we showed that night, which served as a warm-up for our in-person panel of local investors who are helping shape the Dana Point community. The dynamic panel featured Jeff Finn and Danny Hyde, co-presidents of Artist Guild Hotels; Max Fisher, owner of The Shwack Beach Grill; and Randy Hild, founder of REDO Market.

Fisher grew up in Dana Point and still lives in the city with his family. His vision for The Shwack Beach Grill is to be a wallet-friendly hometown spot where you can come in off the beach with the family. He's now opening a pizza restaurant at Prado West in the Town Center. He said it best when he shared how important community support for his restaurant has been, especially, through the pandemic, noting that he wouldn't have made it if not for the love and support from City Council, City officials, and the local community.

Hild echoed a similar sentiment when he talked about the success of the REDO Vintage and Makers Market

events, which have continued to grow in popularity each time they are held along Del Prado Avenue.

That local spirit inspired investment by Finn and Hyde to restore the former Capistrano Seaside Inn. I can't wait to experience their new vision for this location. They plan to incorporate some of the history of Capistrano Beach into the new hotel redesign and create a catalyst for the whole area.

I think Jason Spates of Doheny Bike said it best in our State of the City video. Spates said Dana Point is one of the most amazing places on Earth and that many people don't know how amazing it is living here, adding that because he grew up here, he wants to retire here and run his business here so that he can be part of the community.

These local entrepreneurs are a great reflection of what makes Dana Point so special. I'm glad they are helping to shape our future.

Due to an unquenchable demand from the contractor market, Eddie Dossey opened VinylMart Depot (VMD) in 2002 to exclusively fabricate and sell vinyl fences, gates, patio covers, railings, and arbors. VMD stocks white, ivory, and tan profiles in its 6,000 sq. ft. Laguna Niguel






showroom. Because of this, material orders are usually ready within two to three days. Vinyl Mart Depot carries standard 6' and 8' sections, but they can also custom fabricate to meet any job specifications.

Blood Donation Streak



Could Not Be Stopped By Covid-19 By Dougger Anderson

In October of 1968, I had a huge incentive to donate my first pint of blood: PX privileges at the end of my first week of basic training in the U.S. Army at Fort Campbell, KY. Three years later, I began my first real job in Santa Monica and found myself with some extra "time." Since I had moved to a city where I didn't know anybody, I used my extra "time" to read Time Magazine; pun intended.

In one of the first issues that I received, I read that only three percent of those qualified to donate blood did so. To alleviate a blood shortage at the time, America was accepting donations from "questionable" sources and purchasing blood from foreign countries. So, I decided to start donating my blood, formed a company "blood bank," and recruited others to donate their blood along with me.

Back in 1971, Red Cross volunteers provided home-baked cookies that were served on their finest China at the refreshment table after donating blood ... nowadays, cookies and nuts come in plastic bags that can be very difficult to open.

Today, as was 50 years ago, only 3% of those qualified to donate blood do donate. And, only 30% of first-time donors come back to give a second time. Meanwhile, every two seconds, someone in the United States needs a blood transfusion. Additionally, over the years, the need

for blood has grown due to the increase in more types of surgeries and the number of accidents and other actions requiring blood.

"The world round, a pint is a pound." A person can donate a pint of blood every eight weeks, but back in the 1970s and 1980s, one was limited to five donations a year, then raised to the present six donations. I have been donating a pint of blood regularly and uninterrupted for 51 consecutive years. Recently, I received my "35-gallon" pin, representing 280 pints. On my "bucket list," I would like to donate 365 pints of blood so that I can boast that I have given the equivalent of one pint for every day in a year ... I have calculated that I will only be "93" when I accomplish that goal.

For about 15 years, I have driven my 1946 Ford Woodie wagon in Fourth of July parades, promoting blood donations for the American Red Cross with banners, window flags, manikins, and other props. This year, I will participate in the Lake Forest parade (which will be broadcast "live" on Youtube – and remain available for later viewing).



In 2019, one local TV station began to broadcast the parade. But an earthquake occurred near Ridgecrest, so the station broke away to cover a JPL spokesperson who talked on and on about earthquakes, then a television crew drove out to cover the minimal damage

that occurred. Waiting for the station to return to the parade, one person was overheard to say, "Don't blame me, it wasn't my fault."

Hopefully, a few of the people attending the parade or watching it on TV will consider donating their blood. One of the signs on my Woodie wagon, Old Yeller, states: DONATE BLOOD: It is Red, Right, and You!



Several years ago, I was recognized as the Whole Blood Donor of the Year at a fancy luncheon on the Queen Mary in Long Beach. At that time, it was for 40 years of donating. When I was asked to say a couple of words, I began by praising the M.C. of the luncheon by saying that he had given me the finest introduction that I had ever received ... except for this other time when the M.C. was delayed in traffic, and I was asked to introduce myself ... LOL.



Once, when I sent out an E-Blast to members of a car club to join me, I included a photo of me on the cot, pumping out a pint of blood: One of my buddies enlarged and sharpened the photo,

noticing that the note on a cabinet behind me stated: DIRTY MANICAN. After he hit REPLY ALL, noting the note on the cabinet, he said, "That dirty manican sure looks a lot like Dougger," and then the chatter and abuse began.



There are many organizations besides the Red Cross that will accept your blood. Some offer tickets to movies and Gift Cards.

I'm happy with the snacks and juice after

donating my "old school" pint. If you would like to join me sometime, I'd be happy to have you come along, and I'd let you know which cookie is my favorite!

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summer safety tips

SCHOOL'S OUT, SAFETY IS NOT

ummertime is often a child's best memory growing up: being out of school, going on family trips, and having seemingly endless time to play. For parents, however, this same time can be fraught with concern as they're now responsible for their children the entire day and not just the time before and after school; not to mention, for working parents, there isn't a summer break from work. The pandemic has brought the ability of many to work from home, however, splitting work responsibilities and at-home parenting has proven to be challenging at best. Regardless of the household, what many parents find themselves saying to their kids is, "go play" or some variation thereof, depending on their age.

can have some serious safety concerns, especially outside of a parent's watchful eye. Consider the following strategies to have a safe (and fun!) summer:

1. Have kids play in groups of two or more when playing or going outside. This not only helps deter potential predators but also allows fast notification of any injuries or other concerns. From playing in the front yard to going to the mall with friends, this strategy works for kids and teenagers.


Sending your kids or teenagers off to "go play"

2. Good communication and check-ins. Many kids (and almost all teens) have cell phones or other devices that not only provide communication but tracking as well. Have kids get in the habit of checking in on a regular basis either by text, phone call, etc. This could be when they have arrived at a friend's house, when the movie has finished, or in a

certain timespan. Also, it's a good idea to enable their location sharing in order to know their location not only as a backup should they forget to check in but if something does go wrong, to know their location. (Location sharing should be restricted to parent or family member devices only)

3. Be aware of digital concerns. Not all safety issues are in the physical world anymore. With so much time being spent online by kids of all ages, what can start as a friend request in an online game can turn into very real danger. Be engaged with who and what kids are doing online. For younger kids, consider turning off chat features, posting ability, or other social tools within games or apps. For older kids, consider installing warning or key logging apps that can alert a parent's device when certain key phrases are sent or received.

While this is by no means an exhaustive list of safety considerations, keeping these simple tips in mind can help families have a fun and safe summer.


